

Academic Department

IEP Programme

Through the IEP (Individualized Education Programme), learners were given an additional 6 hours of focused instruction each week, which included revisiting grade seven content as well as materials from previous grades. This extra time for reinforcement and targeted support led to a marked improvement in student performance within the programme, ensuring that all learners received the individualized attention they needed to succeed.

Online Classes

In November, we introduced online classes, scheduled for two hours per day, Monday through Friday. These classes offered learners an opportunity to continue their studies remotely while also being assessed through inclass activities and extended learning assignments. This initiative provided flexibility for students, ensuring they remained engaged in their academic work even outside the traditional classroom setting.

From Monday to Saturday, the daily schedule includes morning preps supervised by the teacher on duty for that particular day. The morning preps runs from 5:30 am to 6:15 am, allowing students time for personal study. Afterward, from 6:15 am to 6:30 am, students enjoy breakfast before starting their regular school activities. In the evening, there is another session of individual prep from 6:45 pm to 9:30 pm, overseen by two teachers to ensure focused study time. On weekends, the routine varies slightly: students typically watch a designated TV channel in the afternoon or participate in sports practice, and on Sundays, both Muslim and Christian students attend prayer services. Afterward, they have time to wash their clothes and maintain good personal hygiene. Optional laundry services are
